

Prof. Dr. med. Jörg M. Fegert is Professor and Chair of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and Psychotherapy at the University of Ulm in Germany and Medical Director of the department of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and Psychotherapy at Ulm University Hospital. He studied medicine in Nantes, France and Berlin, Germany, music at the Conservatoire Nationale in France and sociology at the Free University of Berlin. He got his professional training at the University Hospital of the Free University in Berlin. His MD thesis was published in 1987 on "Migration and psychosocial adaptation". His Habilitation/PhD dealt with atopic dermatitis and child behaviour in a prospective birth cohort. From 1997 to 2001 he was Professor and Head of Department of Child and Adolescent Neurology and Psychiatry at the University of Rostock. He was also a Visiting Professor at the Universities of Trondheim and the Franzens University in Innsbruck, Austria. Since 1998 he was Medical Director of the Centre of Neuropsychiatry at the University of Rostock. In 2001 he founded the Department of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and Psychotherapy at the University of Ulm in Germany (<http://www.uni-ulm.de/klinik/kjp>). Prof. Fegert is member of different professional societies of child and adolescent psychiatry, the Expert-Group Pediatric Pharmacology at the German FDA-like regulatory body, the BfArM, the Pediatric Psychopharmacology Initiative (PPI) of the AACAP, the IRB/ethics committee of the University of Ulm and among other memberships in different advisory committees and boards, member of the Federal Commission on Family Issues at the Federal Government Berlin. His main fields of interest comprise Child abuse and neglect and related forensic questions, child psychopharmacology and related basic science, migration, social psychiatry and efficacy of psychosocial interventions and questions of capacity and competence in treatment decisions in child and adolescent psychiatry.
