Description of the Project

Schools should guarantee children and young people access to a potentially protective and supportive environment, therefore many people affected by sexual abuse dare to talk about their experiences in this environment for the first time. But school can also be a place where sexual assaults take place. For this reason, schools have been entrusted with numerous tasks in the field of prevention of sexual abuse in recent years.

In order to support schools in dealing professionally with the topic of sexual child abuse, the Ministry of Culture, Youth and Sport of Baden-Württemberg is supporting the development and evaluation of the online course "Sexual abuse and sexual assaults - child protection from the school's point of view" as part of the initiative "School against sexual violence" (<https://schule-gegen-sexuelle-gewalt.de>) of the Independent Representative for Questions of Sexual Child Abuse (UBSKM) in Germany.

The aim is to offer a well-founded and state-of-the-art further education on the subject of sexual child abuse and child protection in the context of school.

Currently, contents and materials for the online course are being prepared. Furthermore, the technical infrastructure is being developed. Participation in the course is possible for persons working at a school in Baden-Württemberg (e.g. teachers, school psychologists, school social workers and employees of the school administration).
