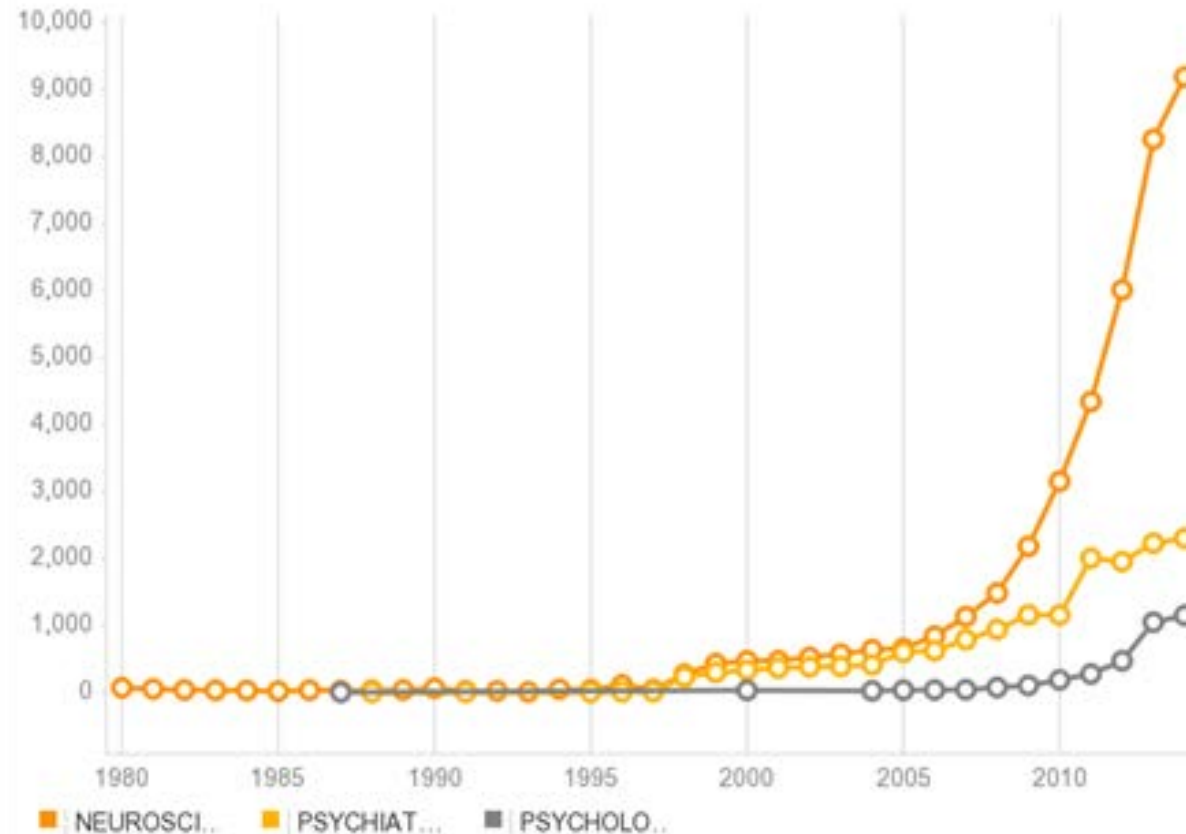


Open access in 2017

- Aim of open access: Making scientific and scholarly literature openly accessible online to all users free of charge
- **9,481** open access journals worldwide
- From **126 countries**
- Over **1,900** open access journals are indexed by Thomson Reuters with impact factor



Growing open access publications in Web of Science

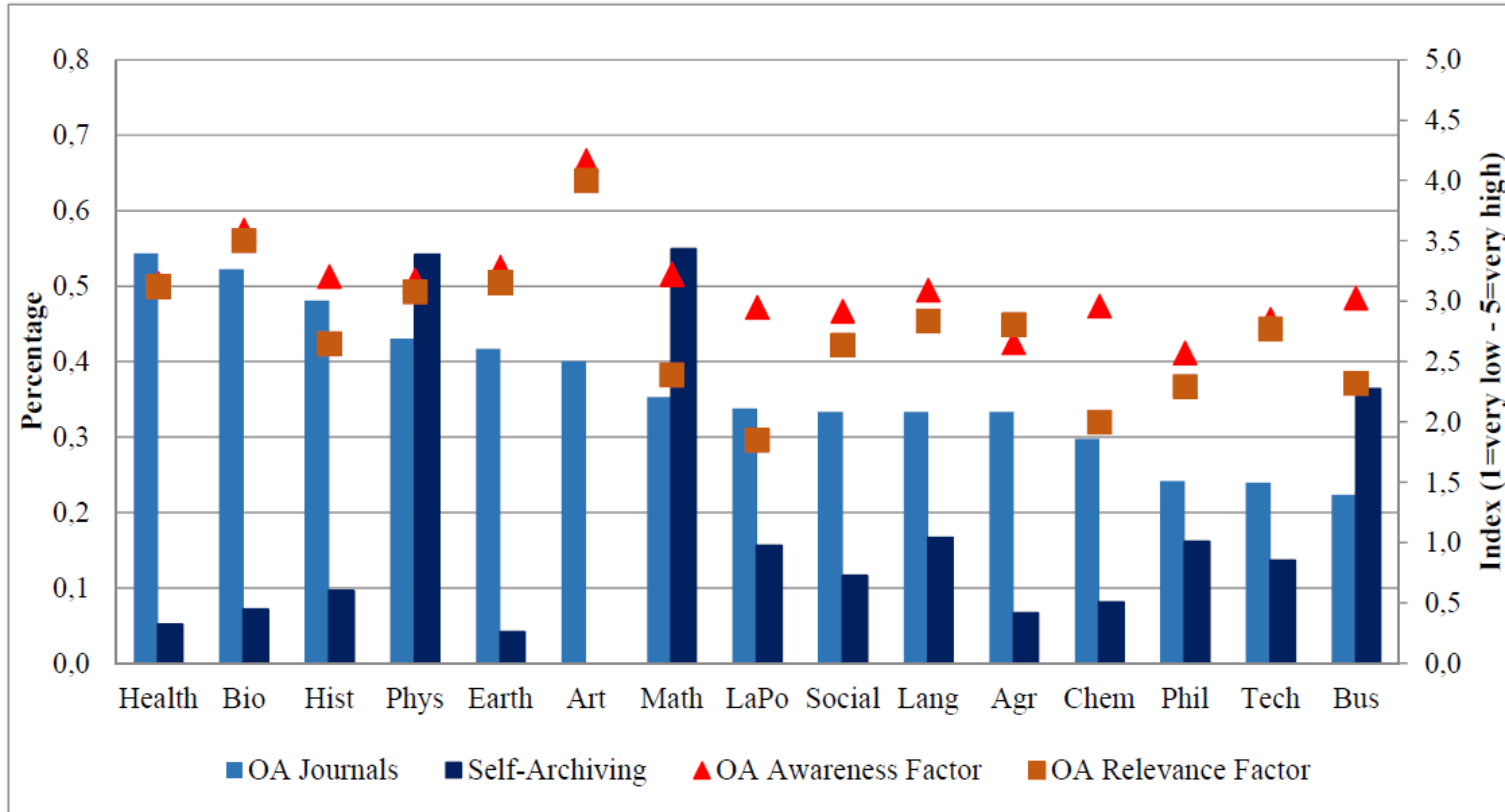

- Open Access policy → Ensures that research is highly visible and widely read
- Publication upon acceptance → Rapid and comprehensive scientific communication
- Authors retain copyright
- Impact Factor 2016: 1.538
 - 139 Journals with JCR impact factor in psychiatry
 - Rank 78/139

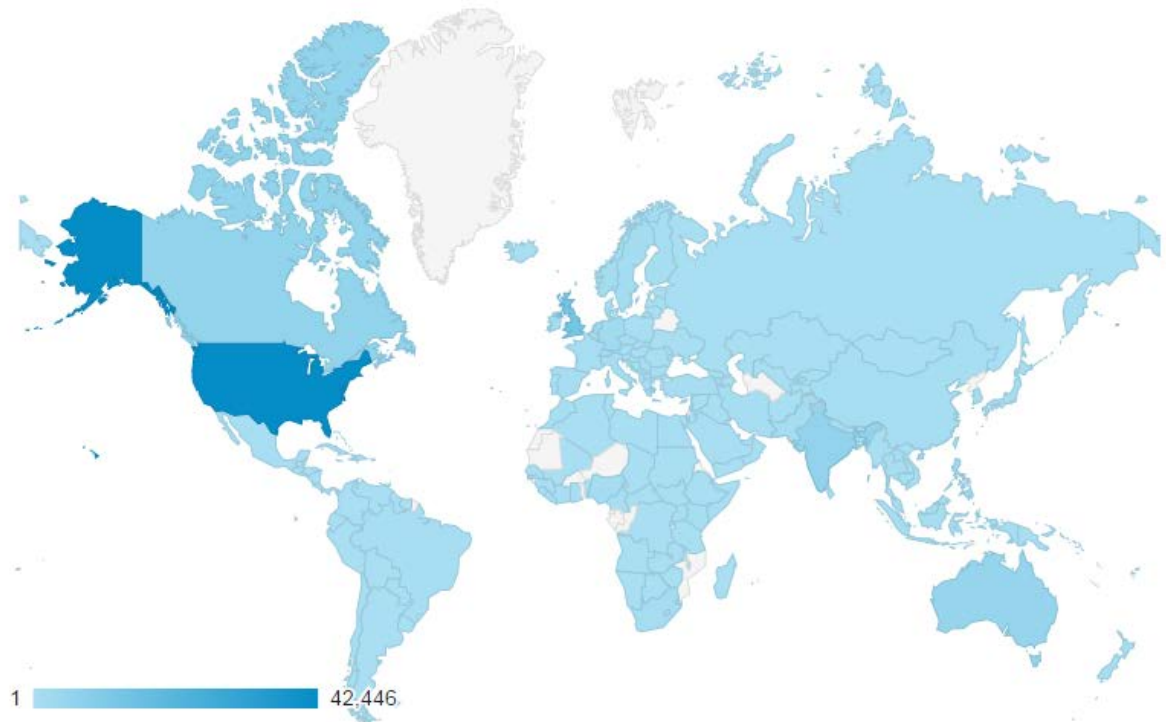

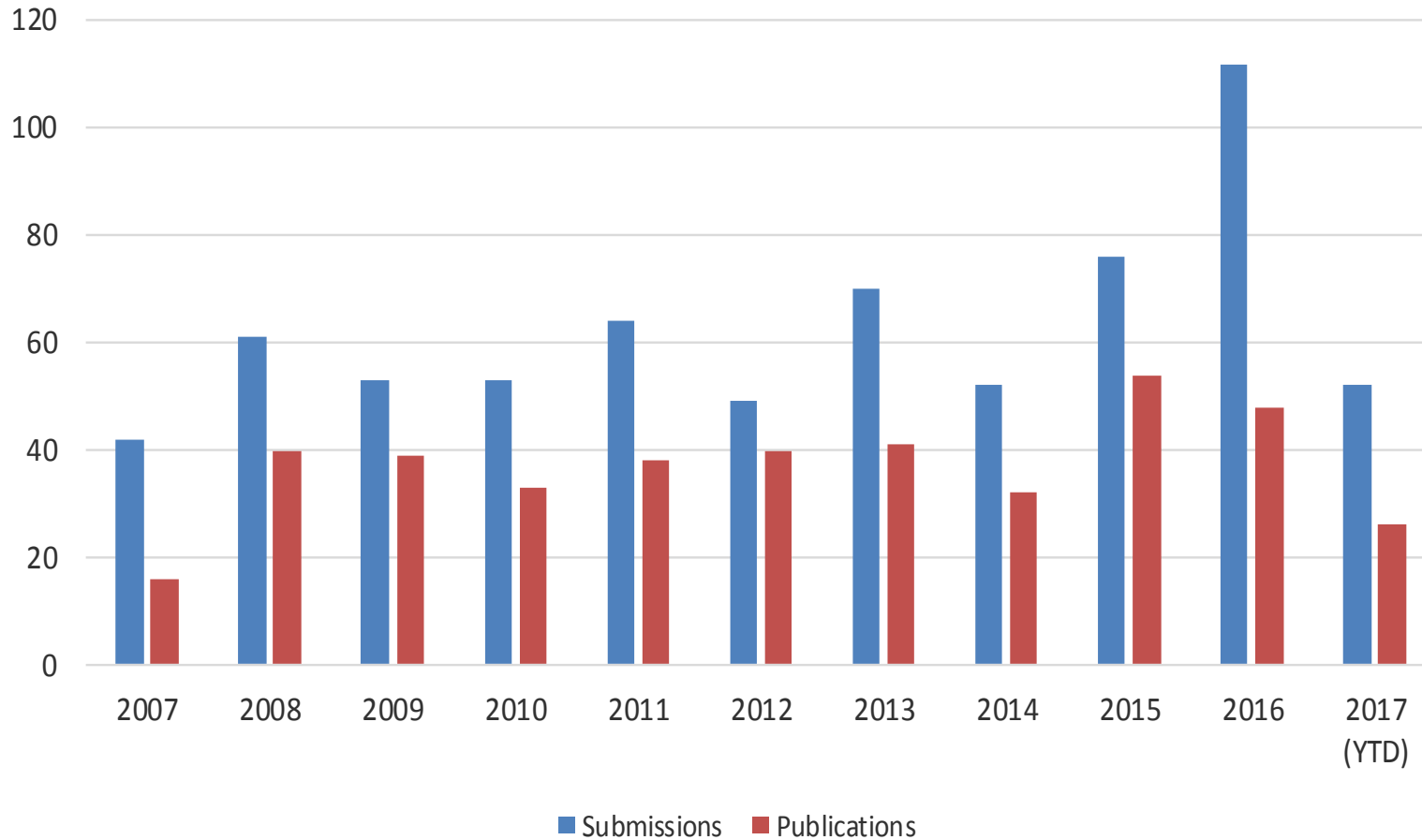

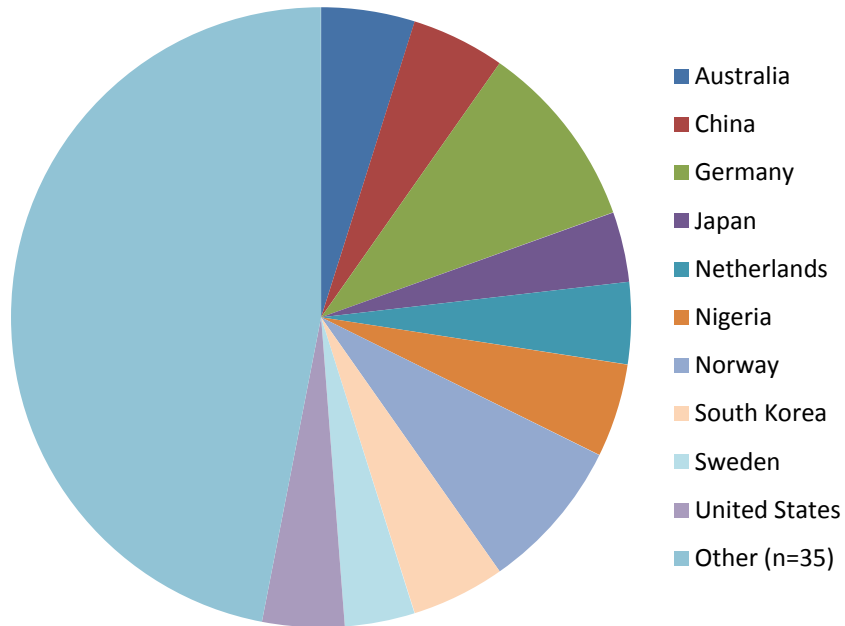
Submissions and publications by year



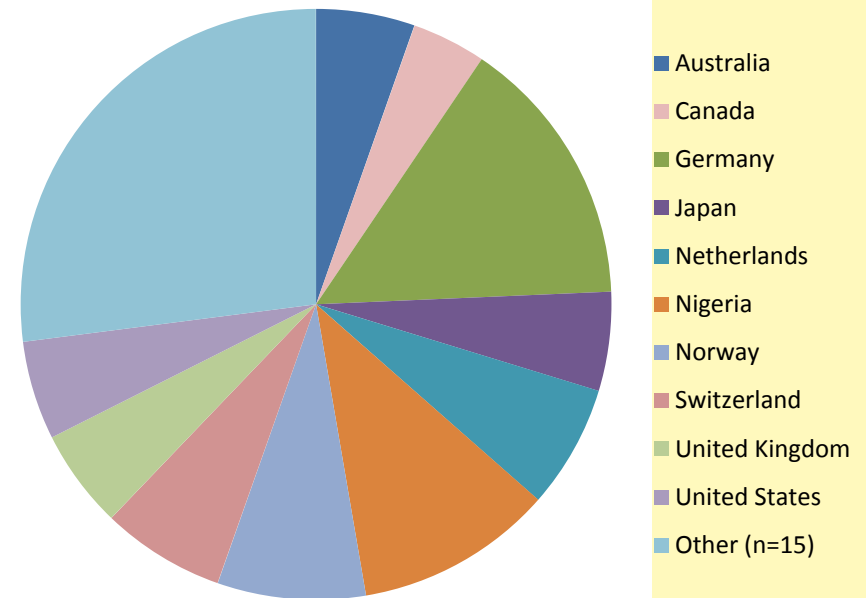


Submissions and publications by country

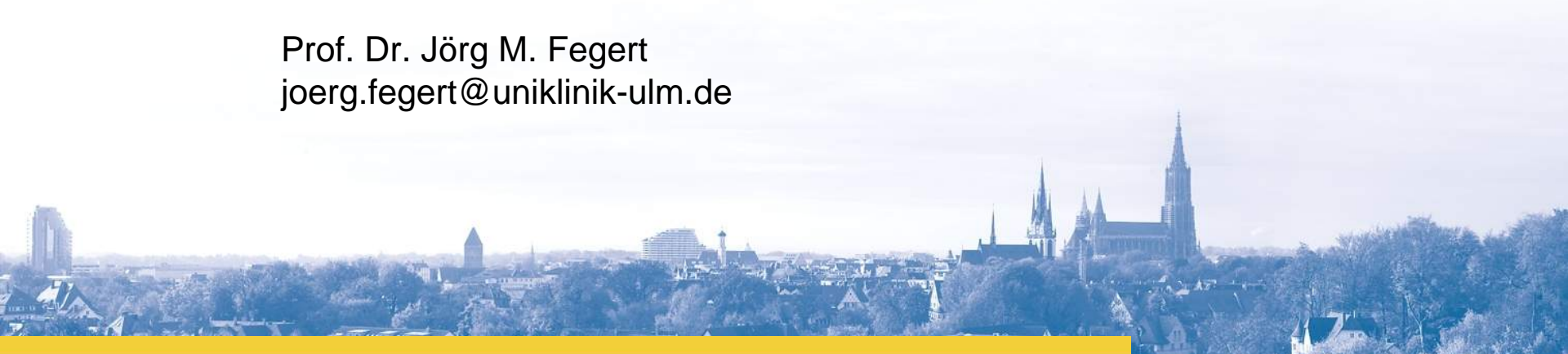
